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How is Joseph going to respond to this? He is 17. He has had fabulous dreams of grandeur. And now he finds himself a slave.

Can you imagine in your wildest dreams what it would have been like to have made a 250 mile trip separate from your family and knowing you are probably never going to see them again?

Can you take something like that and down that old dusty road to be treated as nothing more than a slave cher notes with no rights?

teacher Can you imagine what it would have been like as he prayed earnestly that when he got to the slave marke ${f t}$ somebody would buy him that would be a good person?

Or does Joseph actually still believe in his dreams to the point that he can say, "well this has just got to be part of God's plan. Ronnie Marroquin

We are going to be patient. We are going to hang in there. And it's all going to work out."

Now we don't know too many people like that but do you suppose that he might have been. Could it have been?

attribute Do you suppose that maybe his first night in the sleeping bag in the slave train that God could have said "Joseph it is going to be alright, you know just keep of hanging in there everything is going to be fine, this is just part of my plan that you don't understand, you just be confidant now and trust me."

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Now our verse tells us that he gets one good answer $t \overline{\underline{o}}$ prayer. He is sold into Potiphar's house.

Now Potiphar is an Egyptian official of the king of the \vec{h} land. He is the captain of the bodyguard. Now that Inten means that he is responsible for carrying out all the public executions, he did whatever the king wanted him to do, he was in charge of the Secret Service and the FBI and Homeland Security. And the only problem ĕ working for a guy like that, one mistake and it is off notes with your head. So he is sold into the house of Potiphar.

Verse 2 is great!

have been complied v. 2 The Lord was with Joseph and he prospered, and he lived in the house of his Egyptian master. 0 Ronnie

Look at that! "The Lord was with Joseph."

Just because he left Canaan and went to Egypt, God did not leave him. The Lord is still with him. This little phrase summarizes the whole life of Joseph, "The Lord is with him." Why is the Lord with him? Do you remember last week? The obedient heart and the submissive spirit.

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particularly You say well how can I get in on a piece of that action? Have you invited Him along? Are you where He wants you to be today? Do you want His will? Do you want within the rea Him to keep company with you wherever you go because your life is an open book before Him?

You see you might be being cut off at the pass simply because there are some well-intentioned disobediences in your life. And you have never really made a decision to ask Him to come along. You have never really made Him top priority in your life and you don't feel fulfilled, you don't feel prospered, you don't feel satisfied.

Old Abraham – it was "Abraham believed God and it was counted to him for righteousness." That is the key phrase for the life of Abraham. For Joseph it is the have "the Lord went along with him."

Let me give you two New Testament verses that go with npiled this phrase that maybe makes it come alive. reterences

Let your way of life be free from the love of mone \overline{y} , being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you," so that we confidently say, "The Lord is my helper, I will not be afraid. What shall man do to me?"

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Can you really believe that? Can you really say you know I really am content with what I have? Joseph is thinking, "So what, I'm in Potiphar's house,

Joseph is thinking, "So what, I'm in Potiphar's house, so what, I'm a slave, the Lord is with me." "And he prospered."

You put God first place in your life and you are obedient to His Word and then you can expect God is going to bless and prosper because He is leading you right into the center of His will.

That is <u>Psalm 1</u> too.

He is like a tree planted by the rivers of water that brings forth its fruit in its season, its leaf shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth, shall prosper.

<u>2 Chron. 16:9</u> That is a great one to put here.

The eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, that He may strongly support those whose hearts are completely His.

That means He will support you when you make Him first. And His eyes are running to and fro throughout the whole earth to find people who have got a heart like that for Him. And then He is going to reach down and He is going to bless and prosper that individual. Now if it is your longing desire today that the Lord is to be the one who is going to be first in your life then invite Him along and tell Him that He is and as you do that you are going to begin to experience what Joseph is talking about.

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There are three things that are key to the prosperous \vec{s} life of blessing as far as God is concerned.

And as Joseph is careful to be obedient to Scripture principles, he is prospered by the Word.

And our text goes on to say, "And he lived in the house of his Egyptian master." Now why is he living in the use

"house of his Egyptian master?" Why are you right where you are in your life? Where you are right now if you will honestly face it before the Lord is in a PLACE OF PREPARATION FOR THE PALACE which is ahead of you.

Anything we experience here is a preparation for the mansion He has gone to prepare. Joseph is being prepared now for what is coming down the pipe here two or three episodes of the study. All of this contributes to that.

So we can say, what I am going through now is temporary. This is part of the PRUNING PROCESS. God is at work in my life in this adversity. And He is working in all of it for good and I am in the place of preparation. What can I do when I am in the place of $\overline{\hat{b}}$ preparation? Fellowship, faithfulness, and fruit!

There's a little book called *Ponder This*. Listen to this Has not adversity been the father of great things? Throughout history some of the greatest visions

And so who is to say that what you are going through } right now is going to give birth to something pretty precious. When a woman has a baby she goes through horrendous pain all to give birth to something pretty precious. And God does the same thing in our lives. And the pain and the hurt, the misunderstanding, the suffering, you are experiencing right now that you cannot share with anybody else is all part of the preparation process for something that God has got in tatio store.

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Joseph impressed Potiphar because he was a man who gave himself totally and completely to the task at hand?

<u>v. 5</u> From the time he put him in charge of his household and of all the he owned, the Lord blessed the household of the Egyptian because of Joseph. :ne nature The blessing of the Lord was on everything eache Potiphar had, both in the house and in the field. 0

Now simultaneous with the decision on the part of Potiphar to elevate him to this place in the house God starts pouring out the blessing and Potiphar is saying hey I must be cooperating with the unseen hand here You know this is great. And all this does is amplify verse 2. "The Lord was with Joseph and He prospered him.

Now you know what else I think I pick up here? I think Potiphar is a workaholic. I think he is a politician on the rise and I think he just flat does not have any time the rise and I think he just flat does not have any time to stay at the house. He is caught up on an ego trip $a \overline{h} d$ difficult to accurately the fact that he has got a great responsibility in the administration. And all of his jobs and details in the administration are keeping him away from the house.

And he cannot be troubled with things on the home front and so he turns it over to Joseph.

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Potiphar must have traveled a lot too because he does \vec{s} not seem to ever be at home. You know Uriah the ם Hittite too in the life of David traveled a lot. He was military man first, last, and always. And that set up a° very volatile situation that is going to turn out a whole lot different in the one we are getting ready to see.

Verse 6, there are some things that you just cannot turn over to others.

<u>v. 6</u> So he left in Joseph's care everything he had; with Joseph in charge he did not concern himself with anything except the food he ate. Now Joseph was ne well-built and handsome. notes

Joseph has it all. He is given the full responsibility.

beer Now Joseph is this specimen of physical appearance. He has been hard on the job for 8 to 10 years and in between times he has been over at the body shop pumping iron a little bit you know and he is making a good impression. He is handsome and he is well-built and if he were here tonight he would walk in 26 or $27\frac{1}{2}$ years of age. He would be able to tell you a whole lot about what it is to put a body together and have it in o top shape. Probably watched his diet too.

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Now that is coming on fast and furious. But what is herproblem? Her problem is one of total neglect. Okay, what is her life? Well, the only time he ever $use^{\frac{1}{2}\overline{3}}$ fair use her is to show her off at social occasions. She must have been real pretty. And so how does she spend he $\bar{\mathbf{r}}$ It IS day? Well, she has got her golf buddies and her bridge the nature of buddies and she goes to jazzercise and she goes to liona Junior League and the Garden Club and she keeps eache herself busy and all she is doing is just spinning her wheels trying to find enough things to do to fill the notes empty hours of the day. But she has a vacuum at the critical point and that is at her heart. have

She was \vec{a} terer woman who had just gone through her monthly cycle $\frac{1}{2}$ so knew that she had come without a baby again, another month. And all she wanted was to have a child. Mrs. Potiphar notices that Joseph is handsome and well-built after working there for seven or eight years, o of she is beginning to take notice. So she just puts the direct one on him. Come on in to the bedroom.

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Okay, what does that tell us? It tells us that it is always at the times of blessing and not adversity that we face the severest of temptation. You do not catch a person in temptation when his hand is shaky and his cup is <u>o</u>f empty. Because he is concentrating on the things that he needs to be concentrating. He is climbing the mountain. Getting on the top. Getting where he is way up there and then bam! He is wide-open shot for the Ite <u></u> evil one. David's life is like the roof of a house. It goesto the pinnacle of 50 years of age and then it just slides downward to his own doom and demise. And here temptation comes at a critical time. teacher

It is tougher to remain victorious than it is to become $\tilde{e}_{\tilde{a}}$ victorious. bee

Now you will notice that it has been some time that he has worked there then she notices him and this begins to take place.

You will find when it comes to moral temptation that there is a weakening of the will with emotional involvement. And if you do not run you are going to get emotionally involved and then Katy bar the door. Thē will starts to weaken with the persistence of the emotional involvement.

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Now there is nothing wrong with being tempted. It is \ddot{s} when we yield that we have the product of sin and that is what breaks fellowship with our heavenly Father. So you are tempted. So you are normal. So you are redblooded, American, Christian. If you know and love Jesus Christ you are going to be tempted and you are going to be shot at. It is what you do with it that mak $\overline{\overline{e}}$ all the difference in the world.

 $\underline{v. 1}$ Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt. Potiphar, an Egyptian who was one of Pharaoh's officials, the captain of the guard, bought him from the Ishmaelites who had taken him there.

<u>v. 2</u> The Lord was with Joseph and he prospered, and he lived in the house of his Egyptian master.

 $\underline{v.3}$ When his master saw that the Lord was with him and that the Lord gave him success in everything he did,

<u>v. 4</u> Joseph found favor in his eyes and became his attendant. Potiphar put him in charge of his household, and he entrusted to his care everything he owned.
