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## Due Diligence

***“Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, handling accurately the word of truth”* (2 Tim. 2:15 NASB).**

Peterson paraphrases Psalm 90:12: “Oh! Teach us to live well! Teach us to live wisely and well!”

The *New Living Translation* of Psalm 90:12 reads: “Teach us to make the most of our time, so that we may grow in wisdom.”

The NIV translates Psalm 90:12: “Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.”

Scupoli writes in the book *The Spiritual Combat*:

Remember every day, that He Who gives you the morning does not promise the evening, and when He gives you the evening, does not promise the next morning.

Spend, then, every moment of the passing hour in a way which is pleasing to God, as if it were your last, and so much the more carefully, seeing that for every moment you must give the strictest account.<sup>1</sup>

The following is from the *Ontario Pioneer Camp News*:

### Time Waits for No Man

If your Credit Union credited your account each morning with \$86,000.00 but carried over no balance from day to day, allowed you to deposit no cash in your account; and each evening cancelled out what ever amount you

failed to use during the day, what would you do?

When we say a person is characterized by diligence, what do we mean by that?


The dictionary definition of diligence is “To love earnestly. Steady application; constant effort to accomplish what is undertaken; industry; care; perseverance.”

In the words of C.H. Spurgeon:

Perseverance is the badge of true saints. The Christian life is not a beginning only in the ways of God, but also a continuance in the same as long as life lasts. It is with a Christian as it was with the great Napoleon: he said, “Conquest has made me what I am, and conquest must maintain me.”<sup>3</sup>

Let's dig into 1 Timothy 4:15-16.

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# Teaching for Eternity

## How BTR Can Help You Prepare To

**“There is surely a future hope for you, and your hope will not be cut off”**  
(Prov. 23:18 NIV).

**“Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years, to humble you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands”** (Deut. 8:2 NIV).

*Our Daily Bread*, July 20, 2012, was entitled “Blunders to Wonders.” Julie Ackerman Link writes the following: “When we love Him, Jesus can turn our most serious blunders into awesome wonders.” She then offers this prayer: “Lord, I’m so human and make foolish mistakes. And worse yet, I willfully sin against You. Please forgive me, change me, restore me, and use me for Your name’s sake. Amen.”

Fifty-three years ago I graduated from seminary. Inscribed on my seminary ring for the class of 1959 is 2 Timothy 4:2 in Greek: **“κήρυξον τὸν λόγον”** (preach the word). I had such a love and a passion to teach God’s word. Fifty-three years later I still have that same passion. “Your promises have been thoroughly tested, and your servant loves them” (Ps. 119:14 NIV).

While we were serving on the staff of the Firs conference center, our director arranged for us to spend a week with Wetherell Johnson and Miss Hertzler in Northern California. These saints were just starting Bible Study Fellowship. I asked Miss Johnson if she thought I could do away with outside speakers at the Firs, teach my camp staff the scripture, and have them in turn teach their campers. She did. Our director said, “Go for it!” Our experiment provided a double blessing. The counselors matured in the word as they taught campers every day; the campers had

their Bible teacher with them 24 hours a day.

At Pine Cove, I implemented the same system, and God blessed us—using the staff to bear fruit in campers’ lives.

In 1972 when Bible Teaching Resources was founded, I did the same thing. I just taught the word, giving some 200 Bible classes a year for decades. Many of the students in those classes went forth to teach the material to others.


Eventually, we began sponsoring teacher training classes to formally instruct folks in inductive Bible study methods and teaching strategies. Over 100 students have taken our teacher training course.

For 22 years I taught the word, verse-by-verse, to congregations in two retirement communities.

Amos records the word of the Lord: “‘The days are coming,’ declares the Sovereign Lord, ‘when I will send a famine through the land—not a famine of food or a thirst for water, but a famine of hearing the words of the Lord’” (Amos 8:11 NIV).

We are living in those days. Bible Teaching Resources is poised with studies, study guides, questions, lessons, CDs, DVDs, and Mp3 downloads to help you, not only to study the word, but to teach it and preach it.

### Sunday school teacher

I can remember the day I sat down to "study" my Bible, and I just sat there looking at it and had no idea how to even start. ... Bible Teaching Resources [sent a mailing giving] information on a class Don was going to teach on "How to Study the Bible." I signed up for the course and attended a few weeks later. Since I was a novice at this, at first the information seemed overwhelming. However, there were things that seemed logical, like learning that generally the best interpreter of scripture is scripture. I saw how Don took a verse and surrounded it with reference verses that dealt with the same subject matter and gave insight to the meaning and intent of the verse being studied. Today I use this method a lot and it has its own built in rewards, including the fun of searching the scriptures. Part of the course also included an introduction to the "Inductive Method" of Bible study. I received a copy of Kay Author's book *How to Study the Bible* and similar books by Howard Hendricks. These books have proved to be a great help and I continue to glean information from them today. Over the years I discovered that a great way to "kick start" a study of a particular section of scripture is to listen to Don's recorded lessons. # **Forty Years:**

**I**t was 1983. My husband, Mike, and I were invited by our dear friends Lee and Nancy Bailey to a Bible study presented by Don Anderson in San Antonio. We attended. I think Don was teaching on the life of David. But it could have been Joseph...or maybe Abraham. Mike doesn't remember, either. Now we are in our mid-50s and selective memory is our forte. Just ask our daughter, now 24, who forgets nothing. Her day will come.

However, I do recall thinking that Don was an amazing Bible teacher and that the scripture had never seemed so clear to me. We asked to host Don for dinner one evening during that San Antonio tour, and prior to our visit with him, Mike had mentioned that I was expecting our first child the following October (another good reason for not remembering that Bible study topic, to my thinking—pregnancy is the perfect excuse for just about anything). Mike had also told Don that I liked to write, and that I was about to be a "retired" English teacher, once the baby was born. Mike has always been my best publicity agent. That little bit of information was all Don needed. It seemed he was looking for someone to help him prepare his material for publication in book form. So it began.

For the next ten or so years, Don and I worked on eight books together, mostly Bible commentaries. Don wrote study notes for Tyndale's *Life Recovery Bible* and I added a few articles as well. We were busy. We attended Christian Booksellers Association conventions and met with publishers and editors. We combed over galley proofs and chapters. Most of our work was done long distance....these were the halcyon





Often he would come to San Antonio, but I recall once having to fly to Tyler in a puddle jumper during a severe thunderstorm. This is still an experience I do not recall fondly. In 1991, Mike and I even moved to Tyler to help with the Don's camps and conferences. Mike also handled the business end of things for Don Anderson Ministries in the 1990s. Then the opportunity came for me to teach full time at a Tyler private school—with it the chance to be at school with my kids—and I had to retire from writing with Don and re-enter the world of grading essays.

*Here we are at Stratford, England...Shakespeare's birthplace to be exact!*






## Alaska Cruise July 6-13







## Trail West August 13-18

## **RECIPE CORNER**

### ***Donna's Delights***

Thanks to Donna Anderson Skorheim for the following recipe. Comfort food like soup is great for the fall...or anytime!

#### **CHEESY BROCCOLI SOUP**

5 medium white potatoes, peeled and cubed  
4 carrots, peeled and sliced  
2 pkgs. (10 oz.) frozen chopped broccoli, thawed and drained  
1 can cream of mushroom soup, undiluted  
1 can cream of chicken soup, undiluted  
1 can cream of celery soup, undiluted  
1 lb. Velveeta cheese, cubed  
1 (16 oz.) can whole kernel corn, drained

Boil potatoes and carrots in a small amount of water until tender. Drain off most of the water, leaving only about 1 inch of water in the pot with the vegetables. Add thawed, drained broccoli and cook just a few minutes, then add the soups, corn and cheese. Cook slowly about 15 minutes. Do not boil.

*Editor's note: Thin soup with milk or water according to preference.*

## *The Greatest Gift: A Collection Devoted to Prayer*

This is a wonderful meditation upon prayer featuring different writers who each devote a chapter to the subject: Bruce Wilkinson, Ruth Myers, Otis Ledbetter, David Jeremiah, Oliver North, Shirley Dobson, Ron Mehl, and Greg Laurie. David Jeremiah, in his chapter on prayer, quotes Oswald Chambers: "We pray when there's nothing else we can do...but Jesus wants us to pray before we do anything at all" (63). This book will enrich your prayer life.

## *The Spiritual Combat*

by Lorenzo Scupoli (Scriptoria Books)

This book is a hard-hitting work on personal disciplines written by a sixteenth century monk. Here is an excerpt: "Therefore we ought to bear this in mind throughout our whole life—every day, every hour, every moment; and never allow the thought that there are any grounds for confidence in ourselves" (11). This book will be a great aid to your devotional reading.

## *The Sky Is Not Falling: Living Fearlessly in These Turbulent Times*

by Charles Colson. Brentwood, TN: Worthy Publishing. Copyright—Charles Colson, 2011.

I was so glad I was reading this book when Colson went home to be with the Lord. He had a phenomenal impact on our generation, not only from his international prison ministry, but also simply from his well-lived life. In Chuck's words: And I can attest from personal experience that we are losing—or more disturbingly, have already lost—our communal sense of moral absolutes (5). If you have never read one of Colson's books, this would be a fine one to begin a journey through his many works.

## *I Never Thought I'd See the Day!: Culture at the Crossroads*

by David Jeremiah. New York, NY: Faith Words. Copyright—David Jeremiah, 2011.

I always love reading Jeremiah's works because he is so faithful to the exposition of scripture. In this book, he deals with almost every problem that we are facing in our culture. You will find chapters on atheism, war, Jesus, marriage, morality, the church, the Muslim state, and the nation Israel. He then makes a powerful presentation of the gospel. This excellent work will bring you up to date on many issues.

## *Impllosion: Can America Recover From Its Economic & Spiritual Challenges in Time?*

by Joel C. Rosenberg. Carol Stream, IL: Tyndale House. Copyright—Joel C. Rosenberg, 2012.

What a book! This masterful, well-researched work is one everyone needs to read. Joel accurately measures the pulse of civilization. He fears for the future of America: "America is headed into an assisted-living facility for retired global powers" (40).

Rosenberg writes the following about America's relationship to Israel:

But let us make no mistake: if the United States stops blessing Israel and the Jewish people and either abandons them or begins actively working against them, then we will no longer be eligible for the blessings of God. Rather, we will face God's curse. This is a fate no nation can long endure. Certainly not ours. Indeed, given all the other enormous and existential economic, fiscal, spiritual, and moral challenges we face, I have no doubt that America will most certainly implode if we stop actively and consistently blessing Israel and the Jewish people.

God will not be mocked. One way or another, America will reap what she sows. (101)

living (throwing yourself into) in them in order that your progress may be evident to everyone" (DAV). The verse begins with a command. "Be practicing these things." "Practicing" means to give careful thought to, according to the *Bible Knowledge Commentary*. The commands "Be practicing these things," and "be living (throwing yourself into) in them" are also in the present tense. This means we should be doing these daily. Get focused!

The purpose behind these 2 commands in verse 15 is seen in the final phrase: "in order that your progress may be evident to everyone."

I am reminded at this point of Hebrews 12:1-2: "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance [perseverance] the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (NASB).

1 Timothy 4:16: "Keep on paying careful attention to yourself and to the teaching; keep on continuing in them (sticking to it), for in doing this you will save yourself and those who are hearing you" (DAV). The verse contains two present tense commands: to keep paying careful attention and to keep sticking to it. Why? As we do so, we shall "save" ourselves and those who are "hearing" us.

Stephen Charnock in *The Existence and Attributes of God* puts it this way: "Every minute that passeth speaks the fewer remaining till the time of death; and as we are every hour further from our beginning, we are nearer our end."<sup>4</sup>

Luke 9:23: "And He was saying to them all, 'If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me'" (NASB). That "daily" is our assignment and will make us diligent as we are faithful.

What is involved in pursuing diligence? Let's consider the daily dozen.

## THE DAILY DOZEN

1. Wake up with an attitude of gratitude.
2. Get with the Lord as soon as possible.
3. Read the word and have a memory program.
4. Pray to the Lord & praise Him.
5. Sing a hymn.
6. Say something positive & affirming to each member of your family.
7. Treat your work as serving the Lord (Colossians 3:23).
8. Be a witness (Matthew 5:16 & Colossians 3:16).
9. Do some special act of service for your wife & family.
10. Set aside time to communicate with your wife (date night).
11. Be fast to ask & grant forgiveness.
12. Be accountable.

David McCasland wrote an article for *Our Daily Bread* called "Daily Diligence," excerpted here:

Internationally acclaimed violinist Midori believes that focused, diligent practice is the key to performance. While playing a rigorous schedule of 90 concerts a year, she still practices an average of 5 or 6 hours a day. Jane Ammeson, in *NWA WorldTraveler* magazine, quoted Midori as saying: "I have to practice for my job and I practice every day. ... It's not really the hours, but the quality of the work that needs to be done. I see with students, that they play and they call it practice, but they are not listening and not watching. If you have your textbook open, it doesn't mean that you are studying."

... Diligence implies constant, earnest effort, and is the opposite of a careless, inattentive approach. It embraces every aspect of our relationship with God.

Just as a musician strives for excellence, we should want to serve God with confidence, seek His approval, and skillfully share His Word with others.

Am I diligently studying, praying, and listening to the Lord today?<sup>5</sup>

Lamentations 3:22-23: “Because of the Lord’s great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness” (NIV).
