



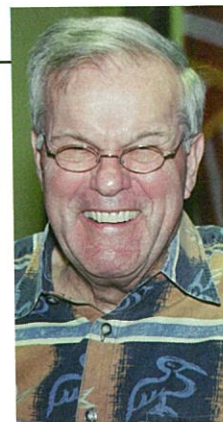

"A nap here, a nap there, a day off here, a day off there, sit back, take it easy—do you know what comes next? Just this: You can look forward to a dirt-poor life, poverty your permanent houseguest!" (Proverbs 6:10-11 MSG).

Reaching double sevens this birthday makes me realize that I am in the home stretch.

My friends often say: "At our age we sure spend a lot more time at funerals than weddings."

That's true, but when a Christian goes to glory, it is a time to shed tears and sing songs and that's what we do at weddings, too. Both are celebrations.

The closer we get to the goal, the greater the joy!

We travelled with our five kids a lot during their growing-up years. Almost the minute we left the driveway, the predictable question arose: "Daddy! Are we there yet?" As we got closer to our destination, the excitement and enthusiasm reached a fevered pitch. "I am going to see the ocean first!" With the first sighting there was a shout of joy seven-fold that literally shook the Suburban.

My question for you today is: where has all the joy gone?

When we speak of biblical joy, we are not talking about happiness. Happiness focuses primarily on earthly things: a good marriage, a good job, a nice car, a nice home. Joy is heavenly.

Happiness. Joy. They are what everyone wants and so few seem to consistently have. Parents constantly pipe the message to kids beginning careers and choosing mates: "More than anything, we want you to be happy."

When people decide to divorce, they often say, "I'm just not happy any more in this relationship. There's got to be more."

The late John Denver's lyrical rationalization encapsulates this narrow thinking: "Love is why I came here in the first place and love is now the reason I must go."

We all know the stereotypical image of the grumpy, groaning senior. The crotchety old guy no one likes, the dried up prune of a woman who looks as if she'd swallowed an egg and is afraid to move for fear it might hatch.

Sometimes our kids can get us to loosen up and laugh at ourselves once in a while.

A ten-year-old asked her grandmother: "Grandma, how old are you?"

"Well honey, when you're my age, you don't share your age with just anybody."

"Please! I won't tell."

"No, it's my secret!"

About 20 minutes later the little girl bounced in and said: "You're 62 and you weigh 140 pounds."

"How in the world do you know that?"

"Easy, I looked at your driver's license on the table and did the math. I also saw that you got an 'F' in sex!"

Joy is an attainable goal as we get close to home, too. It's a piece of cake because the Holy Spirit produces it in the lives of those who let Him. Try it, you will like it!

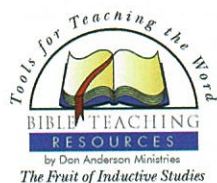

My fellow Americans, dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as almost every thinking citizen has figured out, we are in a world of trouble, hurt, danger, and insecurity.

Our former leaders made mistakes, but we knew they cared and wanted the best for us and our country. It seems our present leadership is tearing down everything that has worked to make us a great nation:

1. democracy,

3. constitutional rule of law,
4. private enterprise,
5. representatives who represent the will of the people.

You say, Pearl, you are getting too political. No, it is time for Christians to speak up.

Are You a True Techie?

The following has been excerpted from the tech jokes section of the website www.digitalconsciousness.net. In an age of seemingly endless technological advance, we want to keep you apprised of the latest innovations!

New Technology: BOOK

Announcing the new Built-in Orderly Organized Knowledge device (BOOK). It's a revolutionary breakthrough in technology: no wires, no electric circuits, no batteries, nothing to be connected or switched on.

It's so easy to use even a child can operate it. Just lift its cover. Compact and portable, it can be used anywhere -- even sitting in an armchair by the fire -- yet it is powerful enough to hold as much information as a CD-ROM disk.

Here's how it works: Each BOOK is constructed of sequentially numbered sheets of paper (recyclable), each capable of holding thousands of bits of information. These pages are locked together with a custom-fit device called a binder which keeps the sheets in their

correct sequence. By using both sides of each sheet, manufacturers are able to cut costs in half. Each sheet is scanned optically, registering information directly into your brain. A flick of the finger takes you to the next sheet. The BOOK may be taken up at any time and used by merely opening it. The "browse" feature allows you to move instantly to any sheet, and move forward or backward as you wish. Most come with an "index" feature, which pinpoints the exact location of any selected information for instant retrieval.

An optional "BOOKmark" accessory allows you to open the BOOK to the exact place you left it in a previous session -- even if the BOOK has been closed. BOOKmarks fit universal design standards; thus a single BOOKmark can be used in BOOKs by various manufacturers. Portable, durable and affordable, the BOOK is the entertainment wave of the future, and many new titles are expected soon, due to the surge in popularity of its programming tool, the Portable Erasable-Nib Cryptic Intercommunication Language Stylus (referred to by the acronym PENCILS to those in the trade).

In the New Living Translation, Psalm 9:2 is simply beautiful: "I will be filled with joy because of you. I will sing praises to your name, O Most High."

We often sang around the campfire at night that wonderful little chorus, "I've got peace like a river. I've got joy like a fountain. I've got love like an ocean."

Then we would take time to sing that great hymn: "I have the joy, joy, joy, joy, down in my heart, down in my heart, down in my heart! I have the joy, joy, joy, joy, down in my heart, down in my heart to stay."

After being publically whipped in Philippi and cast in the stocks in the dungeon, Paul and Silas waited till midnight but then came a wonderful song from the bowels of the prison. Acts 16:21: "But about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns of praise to God" (NASB).

Simon of Cambridge at 94 years of age was heard to say: "I cannot but run with all my might because I am close to the goal."

FIVE OBSERVATIONS come to mind about joy:

1. Joy is a fruit of the Spirit.

"BUT THE HOLY SPIRIT PRODUCES THIS KIND OF FRUIT IN OUR LIVES: love, JOY, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!" (Galatians 5:22-23 NLT, emphasis mine). Joy is the flag that flies when the King is in residence.

2. Joy is internal.

"You will show me the way of life, granting me THE JOY OF YOUR PRESENCE and the pleasures of living with you forever" (Psalm 16:11 NLT, emphasis mine). "ALWAYS BE FULL OF JOY IN THE LORD. I say it again—rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4 NLT, emphasis mine).

3. Joy is the first to leave when sin enters in.

"Let me again experience THE JOY of your deliverance! Sustain me by giving me the desire to obey!" (Psalm 51:12 Net, emphasis mine). The process for David is described in Psalm 32:3-4: "When I kept it all inside, my bones turned to powder, my words became daylong groans. The pressure never let up;

all the juices of my life dried up" (MSG).

4. Joy is the evidence of God's blessing.

"And Nehemiah continued, 'Go and celebrate with a feast of rich foods and sweet drinks, and share gifts of food with people who have nothing prepared. This is a sacred day before our Lord. Don't be dejected and sad, for THE JOY OF THE LORD IS YOUR STRENGTH!' ... So the people went away to eat and drink at a festive meal, to share gifts of food, and to CELEBRATE WITH GREAT JOY BECAUSE THEY HAD HEARD GOD'S WORDS AND UNDERSTOOD THEM" (Nehemiah 8:10, 12 NLT, emphasis mine). The wall building has been complete and now the folks are celebrating God's blessing in the completion of the task.

5. Joy is the evidence of right relationship.

"Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles come your way, consider it an OPPORTUNITY FOR GREAT JOY. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow" (James 1:2-3 NLT, emphasis mine).

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. BECAUSE OF THE JOY AWAITING HIM, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honor beside God's throne" (Hebrews 12:1-2 NLT, emphasis mine).

I trust that this is your response to this meditation on the subject of joy. My mind is flooded with memories of concluding so many special campfires with that wonderful little chorus which is an invitation to come to know Jesus Christ personally. "If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, let Jesus come into your heart; If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, let Jesus come into your heart; your sins He'll wash away, your night He'll turn to day. Your life He'll make it over anew. If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, let Jesus come into your heart."
