

The National Football League boasts many men who are solid, committed Christians.

Tony Dungy's newest book *The Mentor Leader* makes me rejoice in those in the coaching field who possess the proper focus. In Tony's words: "Truly serving others requires putting ourselves and our desires aside while looking for ways and opportunities to do what is best for others" (39).

I just finished reading Drew Brees's *Coming Back Stronger*. He quarterbacked the New Orleans Saints to a Super Bowl championship last year. Drew writes: "You can never let a play from the past affect the present. Your job is to play in the moment" (26).

What a great crop of Christian quarterbacks came into the NFL this year: Tim Tebow of Florida, Sam Bradford from Oklahoma, and Colt McCoy from Texas. These men have made a common commitment to the philosophy of life now widely popularized by a national ad campaign: "I Am Second."

I love the campaign, but I guess I just want to drop it down a notch. The key to finding real, authentic, consistent joy is to realize that "I Am Third."

Jesus is first. Others are second. And you, yourself, are third. This is the key to real joy.

Nancy Leigh DeMoss has written a most refreshing book related to the subject of joy, *Choosing Gratitude: Your Journey to Joy*. She writes the following:

Over time, choosing gratitude means choosing joy. But that choice doesn't come without effort and intentionality. It's a choice that requires constantly renewing my mind with the truth of

God's Word, setting my *heart* to savor God and His gifts, and disciplining my *tongue* to speak words that reflect His goodness and grace—until a grateful spirit becomes my reflective response to all of life. (17)

She states further: "Cultivating a thankful heart is a safeguard against becoming bitter, prickly, and sour. A grateful child of God can't help but be a joyful, peaceful, radiant person" (17). With this in mind, I'd like to make five observations from a scriptural perspective about this whole business of joy.

I. Joy = Sins Forgiven

Luke 15:7: "I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents, than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance" (NASB). Romans 14:17: "for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (NASB). Psalm 16:11: "You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand" (NIV).

I remember back in the early days of my ministry that we would gather around the campfire to close our time of fellowship together by singing that wonderful little chorus: "If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, Let Jesus come into your heart; Your sins He'll wash away, Your night He'll turn to day. Your life He'll make it over anew. If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, Let Jesus come into your heart."

II. Joy = A Fruit of the Spirit

Galatians 5:22: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness" (NASB). Jesus said to the men on their way to the Garden of Gethsemane in John 15:11: "These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may be in

The Brecken

R

emember the first time you asked God for something really big and, boy, did He give you something BIG?!


That's how we felt a year and a half ago. We had just returned from our oldest son's wedding in Southern California. Our oldest daughter's boyfriend had just asked for permission to ask her to marry him. And then the dreaded economy ate another job.

Unfortunately, the job lost was Billy's job that he had held for over 16 years.

When job loss hits your family it's devastating to say the least. With our youngest entering her junior year at a private Christian school, things were extremely stressful. The same day Billy was laid off, he began applying for jobs. His field was data processing and most such jobs in Tyler are held by long-timers who don't easily let go of them. After a couple of months, Billy was discouraged and ready to give up.

He began substitute teaching. After several months and with encouragement from friends, he decided to get his teaching certificate and change careers. But God had other plans. In Texas there is a certification test you have to take, and even though Billy did very well, he missed passing the test by only a few points. You can only take the test every three months, so we knew it would be a very long three months.

Severance package running out...health insurance running out...options running out...it looked like Billy was going to have to go out of state to find a job while Haley and I stayed in Tyler. Or he was going to have to go into teaching and take a major cut in salary. That's when Billy prayed "the prayer." You know the one, the one that gets answered right away in the most unlikely manner. "Lord, whatever you want me to do, I'll do it. You just tell me and I'll do it. I'm trusting



you in FAITH." That's when the feathers hit the fan!

Billy had applied for a position with Breckenridge Village in Tyler (BVT). BVT is a facility for adults with mild to moderate developmental disabilities such as Down syndrome, autism, mental retardation, etc. The residents live in houses and enjoy day program activities, outings, and living as a


family within the community. Billy didn't get the original position for which he had applied, but the assistant director, Jim Anderson, called with another opportunity. Jim is a long-time friend of Don and Pearl Anderson. His wife, Marsha, worked at Pine Cove; Don had even married Jim and Marsha years earlier. Jim said he held on to Billy's application and resume because he was touched by some of the things Billy had said in his cover letter.

In the Gladewater public schools, Billy had been working every day with an "at risk"

student. If Billy didn't come to work, the student could not go to school. When Jim asked him if he could come in for an interview, Billy replied that he would have to schedule a day off from working with the student and would get back to him. Before

Billy could even make arrangements for this, the school secretary called to report the student was sick and wouldn't be in class that day. Billy immediately called Jim Anderson and went for an interview. After much prayer and planning, a few weeks later we were moving into House 4 at BVT!

The Lord's timing is perfect. Billy's severance pay ran out December 15. The first paycheck from the new position came on...December 15. Our health insurance ran out January 1. After a month at work, our new health insurance took effect...on January 1. The position pays substantially less than Billy's previous salary, but the rewards are more than we can count.

Did I mention that our youngest daughter, Haley, had decided a couple of years before that she wanted to be a teacher? Then after working at a summer camp for special needs adults she decided she wanted to be a special needs teacher. Before accepting the position at BVT, we went to an event called "Christmas in the Village"—a craft-type sale for items made by and on behalf of the residents to support their scholarship program—and Haley realized she knew quite a few of the individuals who live at Breckenridge. That made it even more special as we diligently sought the Lord's will in our decision. We even learned that we had known one of the residents from

years earlier. Jean Powell, former staff member of BTR who lost her battle with cancer in 1999, has a stepdaughter who lives at BVT. Robin Dumas, who attends Hideaway Lake Community Church with her parents and whom Don baptized not long ago, is also a resident of BVT.

We have now been at Breckenridge for a year and we thank God every day for these special people He has placed in our lives. We'd like to introduce our house to you! They are each unique and special and we love them all and wouldn't imagine our life without any of them.

Stephen—Our gifted singer who loves the Lord and is a special blessing to everyone he meets.



Ernie—Our resident teddy bear. Loves hugs and *Walker Texas Ranger*. We enjoy our nightly bedtime hugs.

Brian I.—Our "house clown." He loves to play practical jokes and his favorite pastime is cleaning—

which makes Billy very happy since he needs all the help he can get.

Stephen—Our house handyman. He enjoys helping out wherever he can, which is really great! He takes care of filling the bird feeders on campus and he makes the most beautiful birdhouses.

Brian F.—Our smart and quiet guy. He loves to read. I'm jealous I don't get to read as much!

Bubba—Our talented artist and avid collector of all things Charlie Brown and John Wayne. Billy would say he's got almost as much stuff as I do... if that's even possible.

Brandon—Our special, special son. He's like

one of our own. He's usually the brunt of Brian I.'s practical jokes! Haley said when she gets married she's taking him with her!

Clay—Our food connoisseur and high school football expert. He's got a great memory and enjoys quizzing Billy on football colors and mascots. Clay is the son of Cliff and Gay Wallstein, longtime friends of Don and Pearl. This was a special surprise to all of us!

Our family is not the same as most. We have our grown children—Lindsay and Tyson (and their spouses) and Matthew. Then we have our youngest, Haley, who will be attending Dallas Baptist University in the fall, with God's provision. Our pets, our dachshund CoCo and a tank full of tropical fish, round out the Martin clan. And now we have eight guys who make up our "Breckenridge Bunch." He works in the day program two days a week, too. Paperwork, meeting with guardians...it all makes for a busy life. We have been blessed not only by our guys, but also by the many other new friends we've met at BVT. Brian and Kathleen Leo, fellow house parents, have helped and encouraged us throughout this first year. We frequently bring our houses together for dinners, birthdays, and other activities.

God has blessed us indeed! Each day is definitely different, and special. It's never boring, that's for sure! I reflected on the prayer of Jabez as I wrote this article. Don and Pearl have prayed this prayer, as did Bill Lawrence. It is a wonderful prayer that leaves you desiring to know God more personally and intimately. "Now Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, 'Oh that You would bless me indeed and enlarge my border, and that Your hand might be with me, and that You would keep me from harm that it may not pain me!' And God granted him what he requested"(1 Chronicles 4:10 NASB).

Everyone loves a baby. Well, almost everyone. God does. He loves His new little creations.

you, and that your joy may be made full" (NASB). Acts 13:52: "And the disciples were continually filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit" (NASB).

In the words of Spurgeon: "He is the happy God, and would have those round about him happy.... Do you not know that his name is the happy God, and nothing gives him greater happiness than to give happiness to his creatures."

Nancy Leigh DeMoss raises the question: *"So why don't we see more of this kind of robust, grace-based gratitude flourishing in our own hearts and among God's people? Among other reasons, there is a powerful challenger that counters true gratitude at every turn. And we don't have to look far to find that opponent; it lurks in every human heart"* (43).

Romans 15:13: "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (NASB). Nehemiah 8:10: "the joy of the Lord is your strength" (NIV). Psalm 126:3: "The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy" (NIV).

III. Joy = A Witness to the World

Ecclesiastes 5:19-20: "Moreover, when God gives any man wealth and possessions, and enables him to enjoy them, to accept his lot and be happy in his work—this is a gift of God. He seldom reflects on the days of his life, because God keeps him occupied with gladness of heart" (NIV).

Spurgeon writes: "A happy face attracts many of us, and a happy temperament, a quiet mind, a serene disposition, why, a man who has these, inevitably tries to make others happy; and it is, I suppose, because God is infinitely happy, that he delights in the happiness of his creatures."

DeMoss cites the example of Fanny Crosby, author of thousands of hymns, who learned to thank God for her physical blindness—that she had not been "hindered by the distraction of seeing all the interesting and beautiful objects" of the world, and thus had been free to compose. There are, as DeMoss puts it, "Two kinds of people: the grateful and the ungrateful. It's the difference between squandering life and sharing life, between being blinded to glory and 'To God Be the Glory,' between assured bitterness and 'Blessed Assurance'" (79).

IV. Joy = A Witness to Our Brothers and Sisters in Christ

I walk each morning from 4:00-5:00 a.m. in our neighborhood. I very seldom meet other people. The other morning a lady was walking toward me and I gave her a greeting, "Beautiful morning!" And her response was "It makes you believe that it was worth getting up!" That really made my day. I loved hearing something so positive and affirming. Psalm 126:5-6: "Those who sow in tears will reap with songs of joy. He who goes out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with him" (NIV). Psalm 30:5: "For his anger lasts only a moment, but his favor lasts a lifetime; weeping may remain for a night, but rejoicing comes in the morning" (NIV). Psalm 63:7: "Because you are my helper, I sing for joy in the shadow of your wings" (NLT).

Joni Eareckson Tada has always been such an inspiration and blessing with her triumph in suffering and the worldwide ministry she has been able to have from a wheelchair. She writes in her devotional *Pearls of Great Price*:

In a crowded ladies restroom during a break at a Christian conference, a well-dressed woman putting on lipstick turned to me and said, "Oh Joni, you always look so together, so happy in your wheelchair. I wish I had your joy! How do you do it?" Several around her nodded.

"I don't do it," I said. "In fact, may I tell you honestly how I woke up this morning?" Several women leaned against the counter to listen. "This is an average day. After Ken leaves for work at six, I'm alone until I hear the front door open at seven. It's a friend coming to get me up. While she makes coffee, I usually pray, 'Lord, my friend is about to give me a bath, get me dressed, sit me up in my chair, brush my hair and teeth, and send me out the door. I don't have the strength to face this routine one more time. I have no resources. I don't have a smile for the day, but you do. May I borrow yours? I urgently need you, God.'

"So when my friend walks into the bedroom, I turn my head on my pillow and give her a smile sent straight from heaven. It's not mine, it's God's. Whatever joy you see today"—I gestured at my paralyzed legs—"was hard won this morning." (1/15)

CHOCOLATE SPOONS

Try this recipe, adapted from the website wwwthelaboroflove.com.


Dip good quality gold, silver, or clear plastic spoons into melted chocolate. You can experiment with various extracts to create different flavors (orange chocolate, almond chocolate, etc.). Melt the chocolate till it is liquid (beware it does not scorch). This can be done in the microwave. Add a few drops of extract to the melted chocolate and stir. Dip the spoons into the chocolate. After dipping, set the spoons on a wax paper lined cookie sheet with the handle of each spoon over the edge of the sheet till set. You may wish to drizzle white chocolate in a design over dark or milk chocolate...or dip 1/2 of the spoon in dark and 1/2 in white. Just don't dip lightly. You want a nice puddle in the spoon part and part way up the handle.

Use good quality chocolate for the best results. These make great coffee stirrers and some folks just like to eat the chocolate.

Wrap spoons in clear plastic bags tied with raffia and a tag stating the flavor.

Priscilla Maurice writes in *Sickness, Its Trials and Blessings*:

it a hard duty. (246)
